Rules of the *Gurdwara*

When entering the *Gurdwara Sahib*, all visitors must, as a mark of respect to *Sri Guru Granth Sahib Ji*:

- WEAR modest attire
- REMOVE SHOES – before entering prayer hall. Shoe racks are located on each floor.
- WASH HANDS – facilities are located on each floor.
- COVER HEAD – on entering *Gurdwara Sahib* building.

When in the Prayer Hall

- All people sit on the floor (with legs crossed) as a sign of equality.
- All people are expected to face the *Guru Granth Sahib* at all times.
- People may enter or leave the prayer hall QUIETLY at any time

When in the *Langar Hall*

- Please keep your head covered although shoes may be put back on.

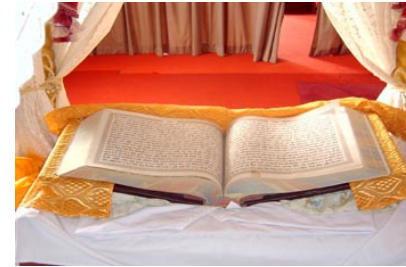
